

## Don't use your personal cell phone number for business use. Why?



There is no encryption on the users device to ensure the integrity and security of the messages



There is no separation of personal and business communication providing a user the ability to enable out of office or auto responses for any reason



Text messages on a phone are considered notes and may be a violation of Protocol rules



Does not allow a users assistant to support in any way

## Things to consider when using a "White List":



White List's provide a user the ability to create a list of contacts that are essentially "off limits" when it comes to capture, review, and archiving. If you choose to allow this, consider the following:
